(909) 885-2045, Assistance League of San Bernardino ○ ALSB has been serving local children in need for the past 61 years. ○ Our major Fundraiser is the Annual Headdress Ball ○ ALSB has 2 charities <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Operation School Bell - Program provides clothing and hygiene kits ▪ The Dr. Earl R. Crane Children's Dental Health Center - Complete dental health clinic which provides all aspects of general dentistry with 2 operatories and working on a 3rd. • Dr. Alexandra Galindo-Magallanes – Assistance League of San Bernardino <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ ALSB Dental Sealant Program <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ ALSB is assigned to 25 elementary schools in the SBCUSD, servicing 3rd and 4th grade. ▪ This year ALSB started providing Kindergarten Oral Health Assessments to 6 schools. ▪ While students wait for their assessment, they are given dental wordsearch activities to work on and are educated on the impact of sugar. ▪ Goody bags are provided to the kindergarten, 3rd, and 4th grade student regardless of their participation ○ Special thanks to DPH Smile SBC for donating toothbrush kits to ALSB
Oral Health Resource Spotlight	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Elizabeth Sneed-Berrie – SBC DPH Black Infant Health/Perinatal Equity Initiative: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Black Infant Health (BIH) is a state funded program developed due to high black infant death rate. Black infants die 2-3 times more than any other ethnic group on the County of San Bernardino. ○ BIH is slated to serve 282 women per year. This fiscal year BIH served approximately 323 exceeding our numbers.

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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Moms must be 18 years or older and 30 weeks gestation to participate BIH groups <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ 20 Group sessions: 10 prenatal, and 10 postpartum ▪ Starting in 2021, moms can also come to a group session as a postpartum mom and begin with session 11. ▪ Case Management – Intervention is for 16 & 17 years old, up to 6-month postpartum. ▪ Every participant gets a Family Health Advocate, who provides one-to-one services. Connecting mom to resources, community service, and oral health education ▪ Incentives to participating moms include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Attends 1st class – Gets a CrockPot to promote nutrition • Attends 7 classes – Gets a baby bouncer • Attends 4 out of 10 classes – Gets a baby carrier • Attends all 10 classes – Gets a baby bathtub • Attends 10th class – Gets a diaper bag full of goodies • Other incentives are given when mom's when they come to a class. ○ BIH website, you will find the guidelines for participation along with how to refer a woman to BIH https://dph.sbcounty.gov/programs/fhs/bih/ <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ You can complete a program referral form on the website and submit electronically. ▪ PSA video is also available on the to watch on the website https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=S0iRmNA6PiM ○ Moms will be linked into the program up to when the child reaches 1 years of age. At which point we connect the mother with other community resources and services like pre-school services. ○ BIH has a new Project Coordinator for the Perinatal Equity initiative. BIH also has a program in the High Desert. ○ Please visit the BIH website to look at all the different initiatives, resources, and campaigns. ○ BIH is partnering with Riverside County in the Rallying around Sisters media campaign. Educates on how to prepare before pregnancy. ○ What If the mother is Hispanic and the father is black, can the mother participate? If the mother is Hispanic, she does not qualify for the program. If she applies to the program, we will link her with LIFT. A Pre-School Services program that provides similar services. LIFT will send out a nurse to do a home visit. They also have a FIRE program which is a fatherhood program.

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<p>Program Updates</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SmileSBC LOHP <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ First 5 San Bernardino partnership - We will be collaborating with First 5 on the Little Teeth, Big Responsibility Campaign. ○ SBCUSD will be participating in this campaign by having media events with different outlets to highlight oral health and its benefits in the schools. Our goal is to continue to provide oral health services to our students. In addition, we are hoping to use some of the media bits to expand our outreach to other districts. ○ If you are interested in participating, reach out to us. Possibly looking into putting together fun dental kits with toothbrush, Potter the Otter books...which we can provide to you if you have a clinic event in the month of February 2023. Be on the lookout for a Poll to come out. ○ School Program Expansion Efforts – The State goal is to increase the number of eligible schools with dental programs in San Bernardino County to 50% of target schools by 2027. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Increase Oral Health Assessment in Schools RFA (stipends to assist with expansion of KOHA). ▪ 10% of our funding will be used to help pay some of the oral assessments. The primary focus will be kindergarten students at priority schools. ▪ Piloted OH assessment RFA, April 1st – June 30, 2022. Big Smiles and Geri Smiles submitted a proposal and were awarded. ▪ New contracts for November 2022 – June 2022; RFA release was announced in August 2022 with proposals due back in September 2022. Seven agencies applied, five of which went completed the contract process. Again, on board is Big Smiles and Geri Smiles. Also joining us is Children’s Choice Dental, The Friendly Flosser, and Morongo Basin Healthcare District. ▪ Already seeing progress! With 4 new districts contracted and 4 other district that are in process. ▪ Also working with the San Bernardino County Superintendents of Schools to get the special education and state preschool sites seen. ▪ Thank you to the dental partners who go to our schools! Also, Thank you SBCSS, Parent/Family Engagement section, and CAHELP. Fantastic Work! ▪ SCOHR (System for California Oral Health Reporting) –The assessment data must be entered into SCOHR to see our progress in a more aggregate scope. As much as possible, we ask that our dental partners who go to schools to help educate school staff about the importance of entering to SCOHR. ▪ HES II Laura Gallardo is working on developing a SCOHR guide to give school staff an overview on what SCOHR is and why it is important. ○ Equipment loan updates: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Minor equipment - we have these in our possession and we will be issuing these out soon. A draft user agreement is in review. We have received the states approval and are now waiting on our DPH administration to finalize. ▪ Major equipment – Unfortunately these were lost in the fire. We are looking to replacing these items, but it will take some time....maybe by Spring/Summer 2023 ▪ We have some funds available which may be used to purchase additional equipment like the portable units and x-ray units. Let us know if you are in need.
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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Workgroups <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ 1st workgroup met in November; our next meeting will be in January. ▪ We met with contracted school program providers, which was our first school program workgroup. ▪ Topics addressed in the workgroups will be: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ School Programs ▪ Literacy and Integration ▪ Evaluation and Quality Improvement ▪ We will be in contact with everyone who has shared their interest in participating in these workgroups and also to those we believe to be an asset to the workgroup. ▪ QI and Evaluations – Monica is working on organizing objectives and measures for our OH program so we may be able to share with you all what we are working towards. We will be seeking your help in collecting some of the data that will not only help us plan locally, but also in reporting to the state all the great thing you are all doing. ▪ We would like to introduce and give kudos to our OH intern, Indrani Wagh, who has been working very closely with Monica to help us with all things data and surveys.

Assistance League of San Bernardino History

- ALSB has been serving local children in need for the past 61 years.
- In 1940 a group of local women formed an organization called the “Toy Loan League.”
- The women collected, repaired, and distributed toys through a loan program and participated in other public welfare activities.
- In 1947 the group joined National Assistance League, (NAL).
- National Assistance League was founded in 1935 and was the first non-profit, non-political, non-sectarian organization established in the west to recognize the potential of volunteers helping those less fortunate.
- All Assistance League Chapters are required to participate in Operation School Bell, but Chapters are not required to have a dental clinic.

ALSB has 2 charities:

- Operation School Bell
- The Dr. Earl R. Crane Children’s Dental Health Center



Funding for Assistance League of San Bernardino

- Our major fundraiser is the Annual Headdress Ball where we have a matinee and an evening gala which includes opportunity drawings, dinner, headdress performances by models wearing elaborate headdresses designed by local designers.
- Fall fundraiser, “Food and Wine Under the Stars,” held at the National Orange Show.
- We receive grants from San Manuel, Toyota, Delta Dental, Child Welfare Fund, and various other organizations.
- Donations from various individuals and companies.



Operation School Bell

- Operation School Bell, a program that provides clothing and a hygiene kits.
- Each year for the past twenty-five years, Operation School Bell has provided new clothing and shoes to about 300 children from low-income families
- These children are enrolled in the elementary and middle schools in the San Bernardino City Unified School District.
- Teachers, counselors, or school district staff refer students who do not have adequate school clothing to the districts Sociological Services Office.
- The children are taken to Wal-Mart and are paired with a volunteer from ALSB to choose their clothing.
- The children receive a jacket, t-shirt, pants, underwear, socks, and shoes.

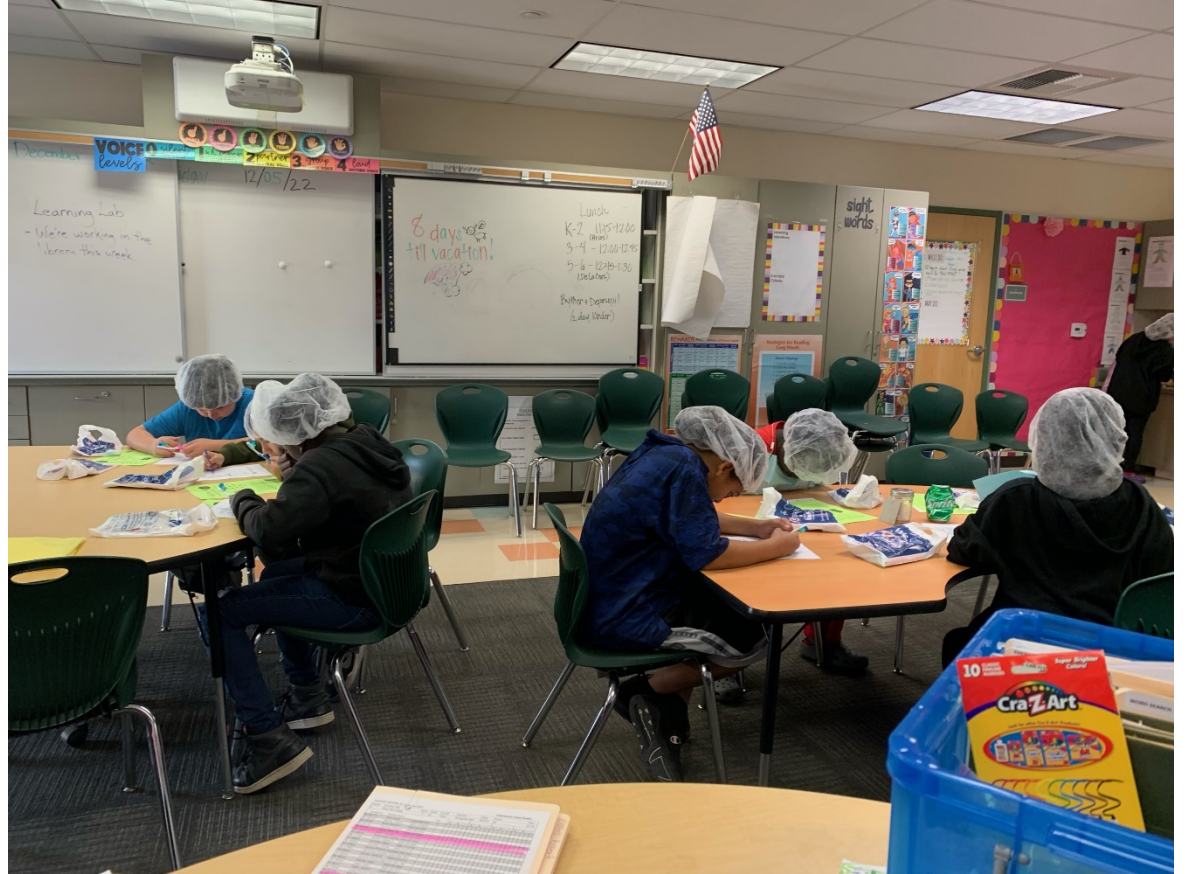






Dental Sealant Program

- ALSB sealant program for 3rd and 4th grade in the San Bernardino City Unified School District.
- ALSB started providing Kindergarten Oral Health Assessments this year in SBCUSD to 6 schools.
- We usually go twice a week to the elementary schools assigned to us by SBCUSD.
- Assigned to 25 elementary schools
- Children brush their teeth before being seen.
- Sealants and Fl Varnish are applied.
- Dental Screening Notice is provided for the parent and school nurse.
- Referrals are made, letters are mailed to parent, and in urgent cases we follow up with phone calls.

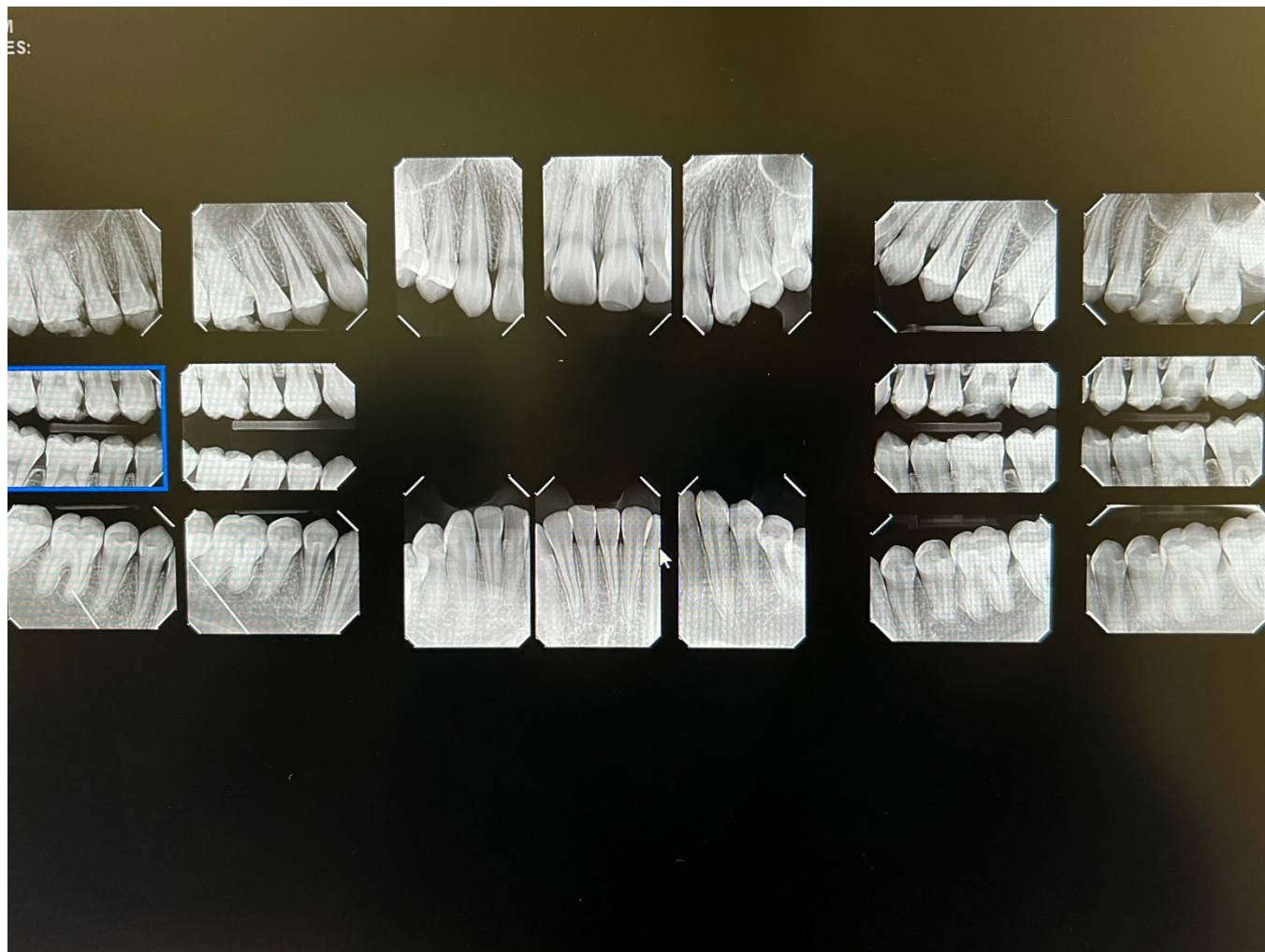


Services provided at the Dental Center

- All aspects of general dentistry
- Work with a local oral surgeon who will give the patient a discount on Extraction of third molars
- Each year we identify patients that need orthodontic treatment, and we have a special fund dedicated for orthodontics.
- We partner with 5- 6 local orthodontists who will provide low cost orthodontics to 1 or 2 patients.
- Last year we were able to provided 8 patients with orthodontic treatment.

Patient Requirements

- Ages 5-25
- Do not accept insurance. In process for Denti-cal.
- \$20.00 per visit with the treatment included.
- Parent or Legal guardian must accompany minor.
- Proof of income for working parents. Ex. Last paycheck stub.
- Proof of address: Electricity, water, or cell phone bill.
- Parent ID
- If unable to come in cancel 24 hours before appointment.

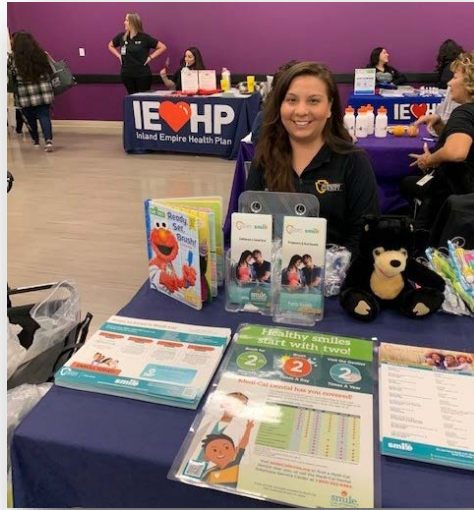

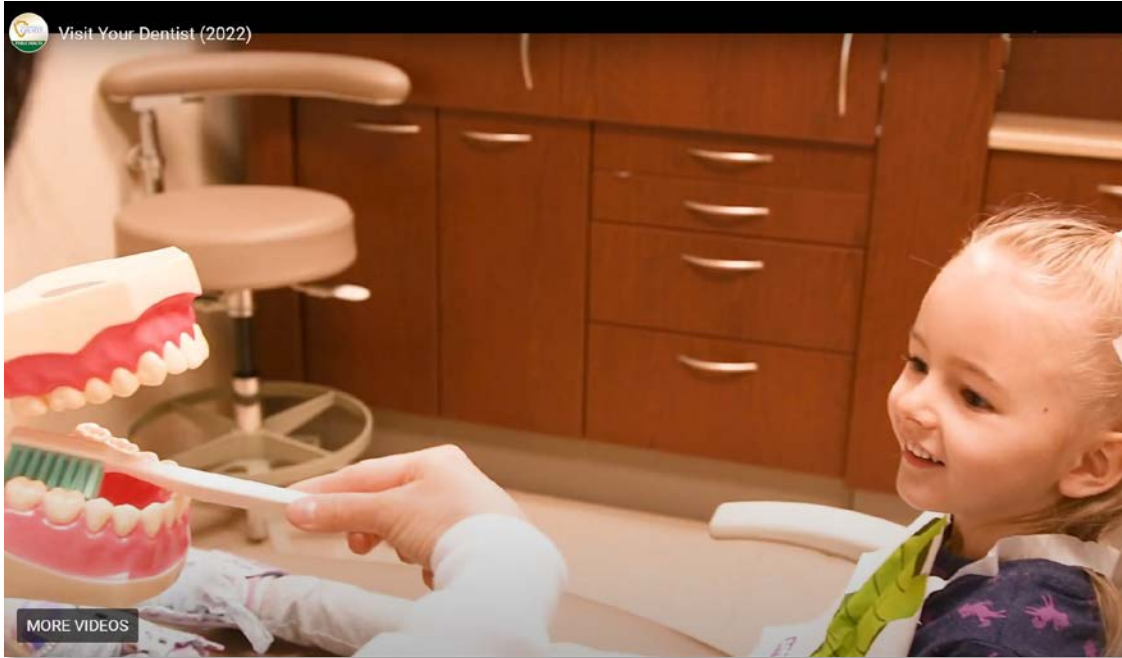

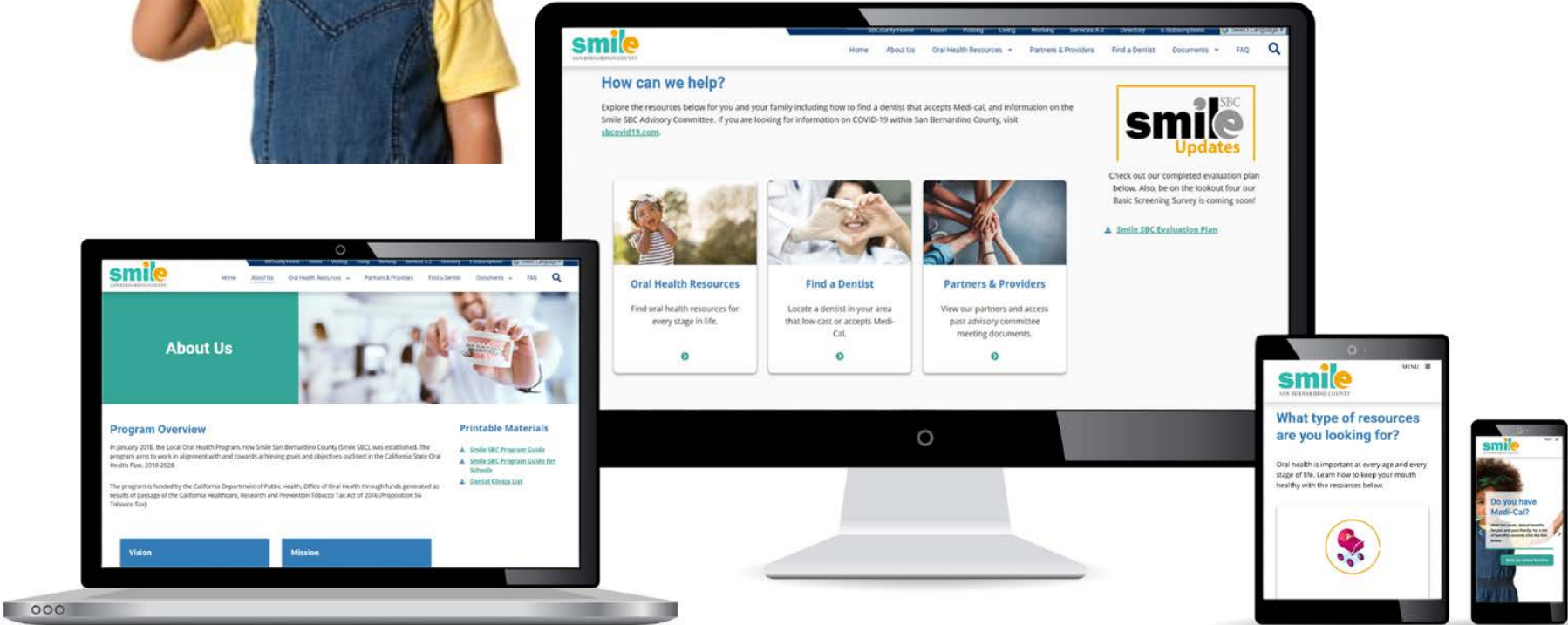

Almost 3 out of 4 third graders and over half of kindergarten children in San Bernardino County have had tooth decay.

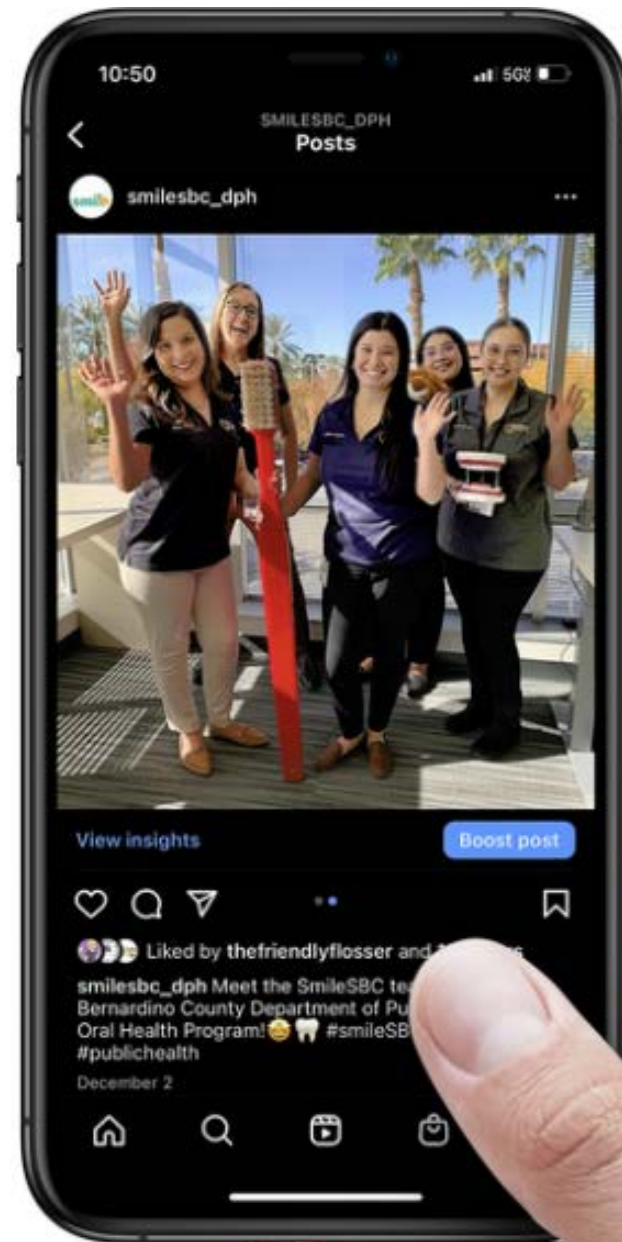

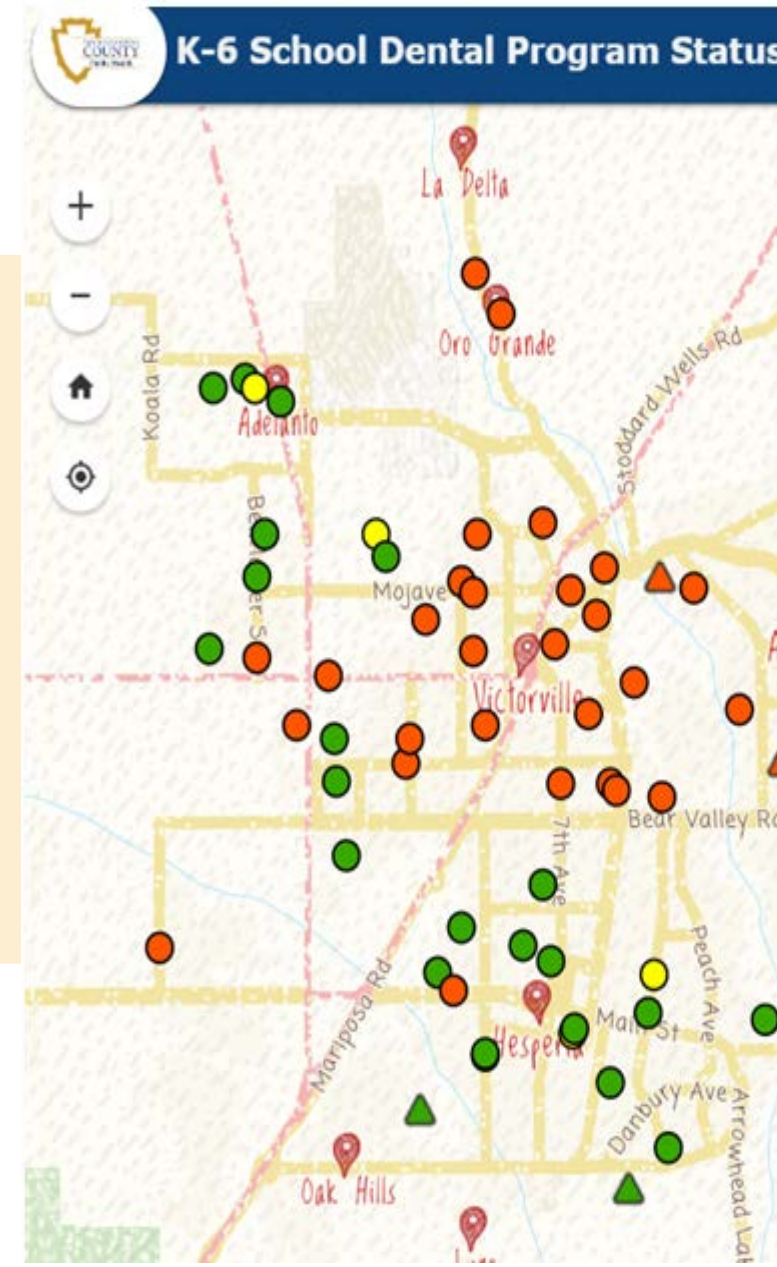

Developing SCOHR Guide

Guide for Entering Kindergarten Oral Health Assessment Data into the SCOHR Program

Entering data is required by July 1st of the school year

Why SCOHR?

SCOHR was developed by various dental associations to provide an inexpensive web-based means of collecting and centralizing all required student data to meet the AB1433 reporting requirements.

Why enter the data?

Entering aggregate data into the System for California Oral Health Reporting (SCOHR) program is crucial to improving children's oral health by tracking the data to determine essential interventions to help children.

There are two ways to enter aggregate data

Whether you are entering the data manually or uploading it, the following data points are essential:

1. Total # of students at the school who eligible for an assessment.
2. Total # of students presenting proof of assessment.
3. Total # of students that waived due to financial burden.
4. Total # of students that waived for lack of access to a dentist.
5. Total # of students that waived for non-consent by parents.
6. Total # of students that did not return proof of assessment or a waiver.
7. Total # of students that were found to have untreated decay.
8. Total # of students that were found to have had caries experience.

Manual Entry of Data

When manually entering the aggregate data into SCOHR, click on "Data Input" on the top of the page upon logging in. Then click on "Data Input Form". Once you reach this page, you can find the appropriate school and enter the aggregate data manually as seen in the screen shot belo. If you do not see the list of schools, email scshr@sjcoe.net for support.

Upload the Data

When uploading the aggregate data into SCOHR, click on "Data Input" on the top of the page upon logging in. Then click on "Upload Data". In order to upload the excel files, the following is required. The files must be a csv file that contains 9 columns: Total_Eligible, Total_PoA, Waived_FB, Waived_ND, Waived_NC, Not_Returned, Assessed_UD, Total_CE, CDS_Code. You can view the schema by clicking on "See schema" next to the instructions. SCOHR also includes a sample csv template that can be used.
