- We've noticed an increase in the amount of visits we get on our website as well as an increase in partnerships generated from our social media pages.

School Program Expansion Efforts

- The State goal is to increase the number of eligible schools with dental programs in San Bernardino County by 50% by 2027
- Increase Kindergarten Oral Health Assessments. State goal is 60% of enrolled kindergarten students.
- Increase reporting in SCOHR (System for California Oral Health Reporting)
- Increase the sealant prevalence
- Decrease Disparities

Progress:

- Contracted with five Dental Provider partners to provide kindergarten assessments in schools
- Expanded partnership with SB County Superintendent of School and CAHELP
- Established SCOHR accounts in additional school districts
- Discovered 3 previously unknown school dental providers with school oral health programs
- Mobile dental providers established new agreements with four school districts
- Portable dental equipment was received and distributed
- Percentage of school district participation in KOHA reporting has increased from 41% to 56%. We are now above the state target of 55% of districts! A new target will be established with our workgroup.
- Percentage of kindergarten oral health assessments recorded in SCOHR has increased from 21% to 40%. We are now above state target of 35% of kindergarten students! A new target will be established with our workgroup.

Program Updates

School Program Workgroup Update In June: Discussed the purpose of the workgroup and the framework we will be using. Results Based Accountability (RBA), hosted by the state Office of Oral Health. Riverside County LOHP and a few other counties were involved in the pilot phase. Smile SBC is now involved in one of the learning collaboratives. Goal: Cavity free children in the IE Framework: How are we doing? How much are we doing? And is anyone better off? Regional collaboration approach with Sandra (Riverside LOHP) and Sang (IE School Health Coalition) State provided tools to assist us by using visuals like process mapping and Turn the Curve discussion framework. **Data Collection** SmileSBC Partner Survey gathers data from our partners that have programs at school sites. Thank you to our Partners! We have received survey responses from all 13 providers working with schools. At the next workgroup, we will be discussing the communication/education aspects of the school programs and continue to develop tools to assist us in collecting data needed for planning and reporting to the state. - O IRC will cover any services not covered by insurance if they are in transition in San Bernardino and Riverside counties, if the individual is a client of IRC. If service is not fully covered by Medi-Cal, IRC will pay for that gap. This includes deductible cost for anesthesia (general, local, etc.) to make sure they get the care needed, even simple cleaning. Again, individual must be enrolled with IRC.

Guide for Entering Kindergarten Oral Health Assessment Data into the SCOHR Program

Entering data is required by July 1st of the school year

What is SCOHR?

The System for California Oral Health Reporting (SCOHR) is a web-based means of collecting and centralizing all required, aggregate student data to meet the AB1433 reporting requirements.

Scan or click QR code for registration, current forms and training video



Why enter the data?

Entering aggregate data into SCOHR helps schools keep track of their own data and compliance. The information also helps school, county and state decision makers better understand the current status of students' oral health so that interventions can be implemented to improve the health of children in our schools.

There are two ways to enter aggregate data

Whether entering the data manually or uploading, all 21 data points from the following forms must be collected:

- Oral Health Assessment Form: Includes number of students, assessment results and referral information.
- Waiver of Oral Health Assessment Requirement: Includes number of waivers and reasons for waivers.
- On-Site Dental Screenings Opt Out Letter: Includes total number of students that did not participate in school on-site assessments.

Manual Entry of Data

- Click on "Data Input" on the top of the page upon logging in.
- Click on "Data Input Form".
- Find the appropriate school and enter the aggregate data manually as seen in the screen shot below*.

Step 1

Are You Eligible?

Eligibility is based upon income and other criteria.

If you have Medi-Cal, you have Medi-Cal dental benefits.

Step 2

How to Apply

You can apply for Medi-Cal in person at your local county social services office, by mail, by phone or online at www.benefitscal.com any time of the year.

Step 3

Verify Eligibility

You should receive a notification of eligibility by mail once you submit an application. Use your Benefits Identification Card (BIC) to access Medi-Cal benefits.

Step 4

Enroll in a Plan

Within 45 days of receiving your BIC, you will receive information explaining Medi-Cal or other health plan options. Choose your plan and start using your benefits.


Percent of School Districts Participating in KOHA


Riverside County Process Map


