





The Referral Process ...

Indio Surgery Center patients are scheduled thru referrals received from dental offices that encompass the Tri-County area and beyond...

- ➤ Child is examined by a dentist in a General/Pediatric dental office
- ➤ During exam, child is found to be lacking the necessary physical or behavioral temperament to be safely treated in the examining office
- ➤ Detailed referral sheet is received from the treating dental office
- ➤ Parent/Guardian is contacted within 48 hours of referral receipt; any necessary medical information is obtained
- ➤ Treatment scheduled once authorizations and medical clearances (*if necessary*) are obtained
- ➤ Notification sent to referring office within 2-3 weeks of treatment




Almost 3 out of 4 third graders and more than half of kindergarten students in the county have had tooth decay.

Step 1

Are You Eligible?

Eligibility is based upon income and other criteria.

If you have Medi-Cal, you have Medi-Cal dental benefits.

Step 2

How to Apply

You can apply for Medi-Cal in person at your local county social services office, by mail, by phone or online at www.benefitscal.com any time of the year.

Step 3

Verify Eligibility

You should receive a notification of eligibility by mail once you submit an application. Use your Benefits Identification Card (BIC) to access Medi-Cal benefits.

Step 4

Enroll in a Plan

Within 45 days of receiving your BIC, you will receive information explaining

Medi-Cal or other health plan options. Choose your plan and start using your benefits.










Percent of School **Districts** Participating in and Reporting KOHA
