- Lack of nutritious food has a direct effect on our teeth and tissues in our mouth, like enamel loss, cavities, dental erosion and periodontal disease
- Food Insecurity Screening Tool (see slides)
  - Used to identify individuals and families who are at risk for food insecurity.
  - Currently implemented at various local health clinics including Morongo Basin Healthcare District and FQHC
  - NWS is looking to expand to dental offices and clinics.

#### School District Progress

- 72% of school districts collected and reported KOHA in SCOHR for the 23/24 school year. KOHA reporting was entered in SCOHR for 58% of enrolled kindergarten students. Great Job Partners! The numbers continue to climb in the right direction.
- Happy to announce San Bernardino County Office of Ed (Superintendent of Schools), are doing dental screening and providing services in at least some of their schools. We are still collecting details from them but are excited to be able to add them as a participating "district".
- Still looking to engage a few district that do not currently have a dental program. If you have information or a connection to any of the school districts listed as "no known program" on the slide, please let the Smile SBC team know.

### School Workgroup Update

- Oct 8<sup>th</sup> Regional School Program Workgroup hosted by Riverside County
  - Priority #1 = Referral and Linkages to Care Priority #2 = Education and Awareness
  - Current Actions:
    - KOHA-Day Videos –Developing informative videos to show parents/caregivers and school administrators what a KOHA-Day looks like in a school setting.
    - KOHA Toolkit for Schools Developing tool kit that will include: a QR code to link to videos, find a Dentist How-to, and a KOHA checklist for school staff.

#### • Provider Survey Results (see slides for a sneak peek)

- At the end of school year 23/24, we sent our 2<sup>nd</sup> annual School Program Survey to our partners. 100% (n=10) of our school program partners participated.
  - Big Thank you to our intern Anthony Amos, for his help in sorting the and organizing the survey data.
  - Full survey report will be sent out later this year.

## • AB 2630: Pupil Health: Oral Health Assessment - Passed

- Ensures children entering transitional kindergarten (TK) have the same opportunity to submit a KOHA form as children entering kindergarten and clarifies the KOHA for TK-enrolled children must be turned in no later than their kindergarten year.
- We are awaiting word from the Office of Oral Health regarding how this change will be incorporated in SCOHR.

#### • 3<sup>RD</sup> Grade Smile Survey

- The state Office of Oral Health is reassessing the oral health status of 3<sup>rd</sup> graders to compare to 2018/2019 findings: cavities experience, untreated cavities, and sealant applications.
- 5 schools in SB County were selected (180 total schools across the state)
- We may reach out to our partners for assistance in encouraging selected schools with their participation.
